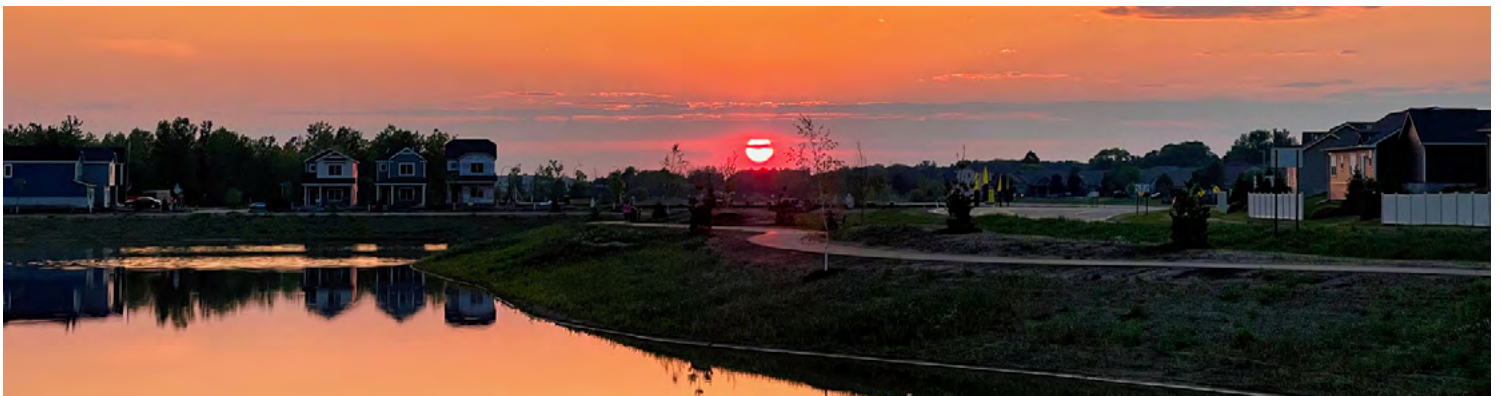
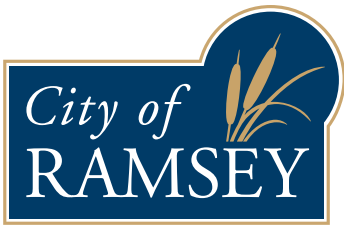

BUSINESSES

The City of Ramsey requires that every business obtain a Business Registration Certificate (BRC) annually to operate in the City. Visit the BRC webpage for details at www.cityoframseymn.gov/170. For questions, contact Jennifer Johnson at 763-433-9889. Once registered, a list of all businesses is posted online. BUSINESSES LICENSING

The City requires licenses for certain activities or businesses such as massage, food trucks, peddlers/solicitors, special events, tobacco, transient merchants and trash haulers. BUSINESSES (HOME-BASED)

A home business operation may require the resident to apply for and receive a Home Occupation Permit. To see if your home-based business requires a permit, submit the necessary information to the Community Development Department. CLEARING YOUR DRIVEWAY OF SNOW

Do not shovel, plow, or blow snow into the street or across the street into the adjacent right-of-way. This is a violation of Minnesota State Statute 160.2715, as well as Ramsey City Code 30-4(13). Individuals who throw their snow into the street make it more difficult to clear the street, particularly cul-de-sacs. It also creates ice hazards as other vehicles drive over the snow and compact it. You may want to wait to shovel the end of your driveway and mailbox area until after the plow has cleared the street curb to curb. The plow may come through several times before completion, saving you from repeating the shoveling process. Snow must remain on your property.

OWNING FOUR OR MORE DOGS

Resident who own four or more dogs need to obtain a Private Kennel License. Contact City Planner Adam Martin at AMartin@CityOfRamseyMN.Gov or 763-433-9860 for more information.

OTHER ANIMALS

Chapter 10 of City Code allows residents to keep other animals, such as chickens, goats, and horses, on properties in Ramsey. OFF-LEASH DOG PARK

Take advantage of the off-leash dog park, and treat your dog to an outing today. The off-leash dog area is at Alpine Park, 6600 Alpine Drive (between Ramsey Boulevard and Sunfish Lake Boulevard). The designated off-leash area is located in the center of Alpine Park beyond Ball Fields 2 and 3. The “Bark Park” also has a pet fountain and seating. Owners, please pick up after your dog(s) as a courtesy to other pets and owners. Ramsey’s Parks and Trails must remain safe and pleasant for all users. RECYCLING DAY EVENTS

The City of Ramsey generally offers two recycling events annually. These events are typically held on the first Saturday in May and the last Saturday in September. The events are intended to provide residents a convenient option to properly dispose of items not accepted through our curbside recycling program, such as electronics, appliances, scrap metal, tires, batteries, used oil, oil filters, antifreeze, mattresses, and box springs. Free document shredding is also offered at our recycling events. Cell phones (no accessories), rechargeable batteries, inkjet printer cartridges, eyeglasses, and hearing aids can be recycled at the Ramsey Municipal Center anytime during regular business hours. RECYCLING MADE SIMPLE

Recycling service is provided every other Monday. To get started, simply contact Chris Anderson at CAnderson@CityOfRamseyMN.Gov or 763-433-9817 to request a recycling cart. Then, contact the City at 763-576-4343 to set up your utility billing account. Visit www.cityoframseymn.gov/376 for details on acceptable materials and the collection schedule. A quarterly fee of \$11.94 (just \$3.98 per month) applies to each household for this service. Recyclables should be clean, but no need to separate them—just remember to avoid using plastic bags for your recyclables. If you use bags, please place them in paper bags.

RECYCLING ORGANICS

Ramsey offers a convenient Organics Recycling Drop-Off program at no cost to residents. To learn more and register, visit www.cityoframseymn.gov/578. After registering, you can pick up a free starter kit from the Planning Division in City Hall.

RENTAL LICENSING & INSPECTIONS

Rental housing within City limits is required to be licensed and inspected regularly. To inquire about obtaining a license or see if a license is covering your rental home, contact Rental Housing Inspector Dana Verbeek at DVerbeek@CityOfRamseyMN.Gov or 763-433-9824.

SOLICITING

All peddlers and solicitors are required to be licensed in Ramsey. Solicitors traveling door-to-door must wear their City-issued badge at all times and carry their license certificate. Soliciting is allowed from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. No peddler or solicitor shall enter in or upon any premises where residents have posted “No Soliciting” signs on their property. Building Division Information

Building permits are required to construct, enlarge, alter, repair, demolish, or change the occupancy of a building or structure. Mechanical, plumbing, electrical, and septic permits may also be required. For a complete list of work that requires a permit or to apply for a permit, visit www.cityoframseymn.gov/permits or call the Building Division at 763-433-9850.

WHY DO I NEED A PERMIT?

A permit ensures proper services are provided to safeguard life, health, property, and public welfare. If work is done improperly, such work can become unsafe for the homeowners and their families, as well as devalue their homes.

WHO MAY APPLY FOR A PERMIT?

Property owners may apply for a permit as long as they own and occupy the property. A licensed contractor may pull the required permit(s) if the property is a rental.

Property owners can apply for permits other than plumbing and electrical. A licensed contractor may apply for any permit. A separate City license may be required depending on the type of work being completed.

PERMIT AND APPLICATION FEES

Permit fees vary depending on the type of work. Some have a flat fee and some are based on the valuation. A \$20 or \$25 application fee (based on permit type) will be collected for every permit which requires a plan review. This fee will be subtracted from the overall permit fee upon permit issuance. The application fee is non-refundable.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION HANDOUTS

If you are planning a construction project soon, the Building Division offers handouts that may assist you with your project.

BUILDING, MECHANICAL AND PLUMBING INSPECTIONS

Once a permit has been issued, an inspection record card listing all required inspections is provided. You may schedule an inspection online at www.cityoframseymn.gov/permits or call the building inspection line at 763-433-9850.

ELECTRICAL INSPECTIONS

The City administers the State electrical code locally within the City of Ramsey and Togle Inspections contracts with the City to conduct all electrical inspections. Electrical permitting is done online at www.cityoframseymn.gov/permits.

SEPTIC INFORMATION

A septic permit is required for septic tanks, systems, pumping, and removal. The City administers Minnesota Rules Chapters 7080 through 7083 – Subsurface Sewage Treatment Systems (SSTS). Pumping is typically recommended every three years, but this can vary depending on factors such as tank size, household size, and water usage. For the most accurate schedule, check your past pumping permits to establish an accurate schedule and ensure regulatory compliance. Owners of an SSTS shall work with a licensed sewage professional to provide required maintenance and compliance checks on their systems.

PAID ON-CALL FIREFIGHTERS

The City recruits paid on-call firefighters on an “as needed” basis. Applications are available during the recruitment period (usually in the fall) on the Employment page of the City’s website at www.cityoframseymn.gov/employment.

RECREATIONAL FIRES

Permits are not needed for fires under three feet in diameter. A recreational fire must use approved starter fuel and dry, clean wood, producing minimal smoke and odor beyond the property line. It should be supervised by an adult, intended for recreational, ceremonial, food preparation, or social purposes, and must be fully extinguished before leaving. Fires must be at least twenty-five feet from any structure unless approved by the Fire Chief.

Permitted starter fuels include dry paper, clean cardboard, liquid charcoal starter, paraffin candles, propane torches, and dry kindling. Burning hours are:

- Monday–Friday: 6:00 p.m.-6:00 a.m.
- Saturday–Sunday: 12:00 p.m.-6:00 a.m.
- Federal Holidays: 12:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m.

A recreational fire site must be a three-foot diameter circle surrounded by non-combustible material, located on the ground or in a raised bed. Mobile cooking devices and burning barrels are not recognized as recreational fires, and it is illegal to burn garbage or construction materials.

OPEN BURNING PERMITS

Permits are required for fires over three feet in diameter. Fires exceeding these guidelines are classified as open burns, necessitating a permit. Conducting an open burn without a permit may result in the fire being extinguished, potential citation under City Code §7.83, and penalties including misdemeanor charges and civil damages for injuries or property damage, as well as costs for fire suppression services from the Ramsey Fire Department at \$300/hour.

To apply for an open burn permit, or for details on permitted purposes, materials, and safety requirements, contact the Ramsey Fire Department at 763-427-4452. Allow at least 10 days for application processing after the preliminary inspection.

FIRE SAFETY/AIR QUALITY REQUIREMENTS OF OPEN BURN PERMITS

You are responsible:

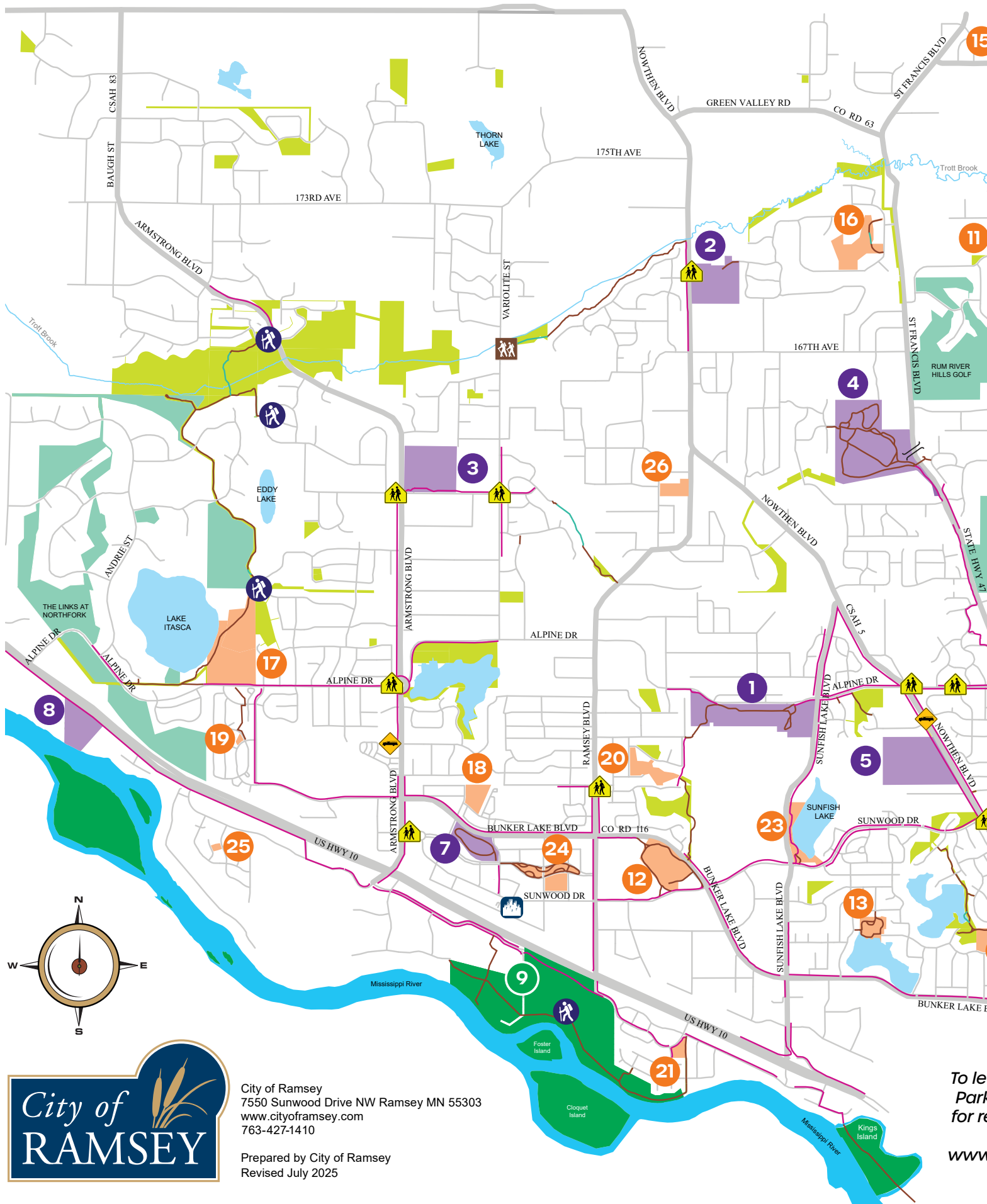
- To keep the fire under control and assume responsibility for all damages and costs resulting from burning done under the permit.
- To attend to the fire until completely extinguished.
- Not to burn if there is a practical alternative method for disposal of the material such as chipping or composting.
- To use a clean burning device to start a fire.
- Not to conduct burning during any air quality alert.
- Not to burn paper or cardboard except as provided under Minnesota Statute 17.135.
- To extinguish the fire immediately if the permit is revoked.

- To have the permit available at the burn site for inspection.
- That prevailing wind **MUST** be away from nearby occupied buildings and not exceed 10 mph.
- That fire will not be allowed to smolder without flame.
- Burning barrels are prohibited, as well as burning leaves, garbage, furniture, etc.

Prohibited Materials: oils, rubber, plastics, tires, and chemically treated materials such as railroad ties, treated lumber, composite shingles, tar paper, insulation, composition board, sheetrock, wiring, paint, hazardous, and industrial solid waste.

MINNESOTA RULES parts 7005.0705 to 7005.0805 "Open Burning," Minnesota Statutes 88.16 to 88.17 and Minnesota Fire Code are adopted by reference and made a part of Ramsey City Code.

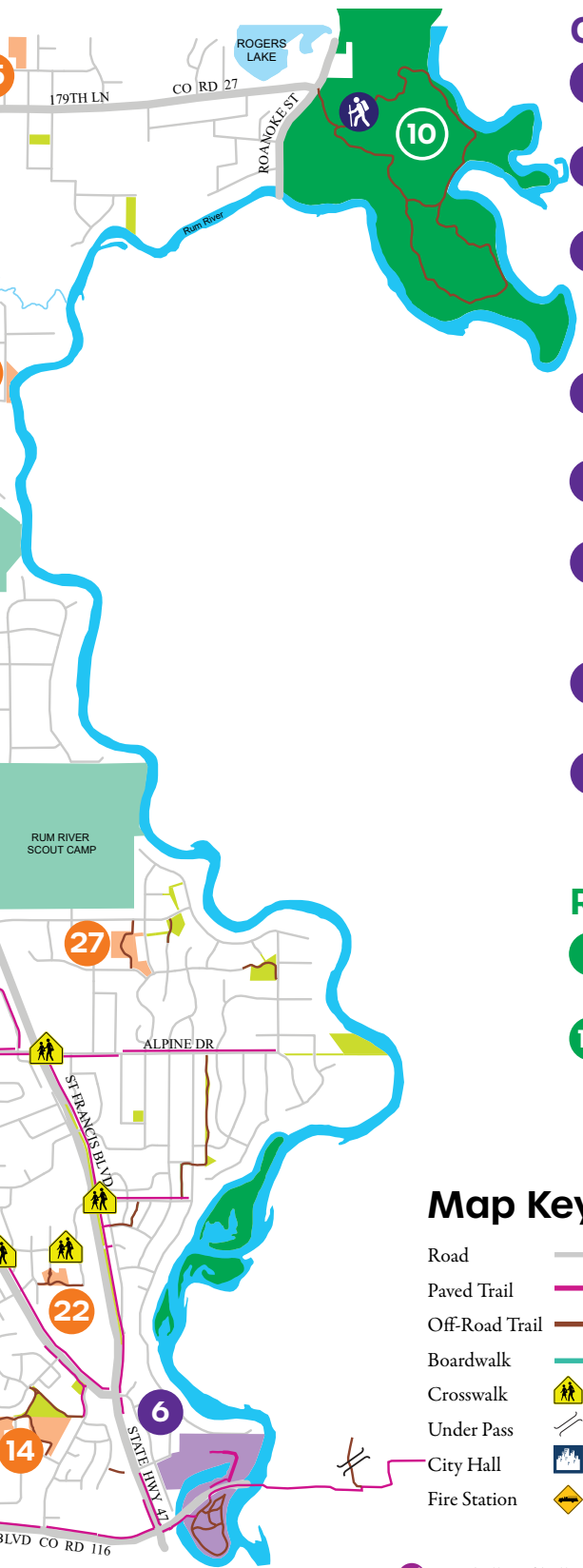

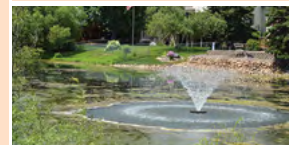

Parking

PARKING IS PROHIBITED ON CITY STREETS:

- Between the hours of 2:00-6:00 a.m. If necessary, you can call the Ramsey Police Department at 763-427-1212 to request an overnight, no tag authorization.
- Within 20 feet of a fire hydrant.
- Within a properly marked fire lane.
- Within a crosswalk.
- Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection.
- At any place where official signs prohibit stopping.
- On any boulevard.
- Directly across from or within three feet of either side of a public or private driveway.
- With the keys in the ignition. Passenger automobiles parked on a public street, alley, public parking lot, or place affected by the public interest in the City shall lock the ignition, remove the key, and take it with them.
- When, within the preceding 24 hours, there is an accumulation of falling or blowing snow two inches or more in depth at street level anywhere within that block until the block has been cleared of snow from curb to curb (commonly referred to as “snowbirds”).

OFF-STREET PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Off-street parking in residential areas is permitted only on an improved surface and blacktop or concrete is required in all Metropolitan Urban Service Areas (MUSA). For a complete list of regulations, please refer to City Code Section 106.460 (Residential off-street parking).

- Motor vehicles that are currently licensed and operable, primarily used for private transportation or recreational purposes, may be parked in a driveway or in the side or rear yard. They must be on a residential parking surface made of either pavement or concrete if located within the MUSA, or on recycled concrete, pavement, or prepared gravel

if outside those boundaries. The number of items allowed depends on the size of the lot. Contact Code Enforcement at CodeEnforcement@CityOfRamseyMN.Gov or 763-433-9840 for more information.

- Commercial use motor vehicles and equipment may be parked outside for short-term periods (eight hours or less) within a 24-hour period or longer terms under the following conditions:
 - The vehicles and/or equipment are screened to a degree of 75 percent at the ground level view, within the MUSA and to a degree of 50 percent at the ground level view outside the MUSA.
 - The vehicles and/or equipment shall be parked only in the side yard or rear yard of the subject property and said items should be parked on a residential parking surface that consists of either bituminous pavement or concrete, or outside the boundaries of the MUSA on a minimum of con bit or prepared gravel with at least two-inch base.

Contact the Community Development Department regarding commercial use vehicles and equipment that cannot meet the criteria established above.

Active agriculture vehicles and equipment necessary to sustain agricultural uses are allowed and not required to park on prepared surfaces or screened.

To park private and/or commercial vehicles and equipment on the property, the individual who owns or leases the parcel must also own those vehicles and equipment. The City will use registration records to identify the registered owner of the vehicles and equipment, along with their registered address.

Code Enforcement Frequently Asked Questions

The Code Enforcement Department is committed to helping new residents transition smoothly while fostering a positive outlook for the future. We aim to address common complaints and clarify the Ramsey City Codes. Our team is focused on educating residents to minimize future enforcement needs. Below is some useful information for newcomers or anyone looking for a refresher.

HOW LONG CAN MY GRASS BE?

City Code permits grass to reach eight inches in turf areas. To create a natural yard, a maintenance plan must be submitted to the Planning Division, detailing natural areas, species, and maintenance methods.

HOW MANY ITEMS CAN I HAVE OUTSIDE?

We get many complaints about the number of items left outside on a property, such as cars, boats, trailers, snowmobiles, and the like, which can be found in Chapter 106 of the Zoning Code.

- a. Six items are allowed for outdoor storage and parking on parcels less than one acre in size.
- b. Eight items are allowed for outdoor storage and parking on parcels between one and 1.99 acres in size.
- c. Ten items are allowed for outdoor storage and parking on parcels between two and 4.99 acres in size.
- d. Twelve items are allowed for outdoor storage and parking on parcels five acres or greater in size.

CAN I HAVE A CANOPY TENT OR PORTABLE GARAGE?

Temporary accessory structures are not permitted due to their inability to withstand Minnesota's harsh climate. The Minnesota State Building Code governs structures over 200 square feet, and many fail to meet local snow and wind load requirements, as well as zoning and material standards. For details on permitted structures, contact the Planning Division.

HOW MANY ANIMALS CAN I HAVE?

The number of allowed animals depends on your property's size. Check Chapter 10 of the City Code for specifics on the number of animals. Chickens are permitted but must adhere to the limit allowed by City Code.

CAN I TAKE MY SEMI-TRUCK HOME?

Commercial vehicles can park in all districts for up to eight hours. If parked longer, they must be on an improved surface in side or rear yards, screened from view—50 percent outside of the Metropolitan Urban Service Areas (MUSA) district and 75% within the MUSA districts. MUSA can be found in Section 106-460 of the Zoning Code.

CAN I HAVE A DUMPSTER OR STORAGE CONTAINER PLACED ON THE ROAD?

No. These are considered obstructions of a public way.

WILL THE CITY INSPECT RENTAL COMPLAINTS?

Trees/Planting and Street Visibility

Safety on our streets depends on good visibility. Vegetation growing in easements and/or road right-of-ways may obscure sight lines, endangering motorists and pedestrians. Overgrown vegetation needs to be pruned, removed, or transplanted.

Planting under power lines, in the road easement, or near property lines may create problems in the future. Spruce trees, for instance, hold their lower limbs, making them a popular choice for screening purposes. However, the same characteristic creates problems when the tree matures and begins blocking sight lines. When this happens, the tree must be radically pruned, destroying its beauty. When choosing trees for your yard, carefully consider their location, mature size, and growth characteristics before planting.

- Ramsey has a population of over 28,560 residents and is continuing to grow.
- Covering an area of 29 square miles, Ramsey is bordered by the Rum and Mississippi Rivers.
- The community is home to over 600 businesses, including Connexus Energy, Life Fitness, Ace Solid Waste, Delta ModTech, Anderson Dahlen, Multi-Source Manufacturing, RJM, HOYA Optical, Diamond Graphics, and Green Valley Greenhouse.
- Ramsey features two championship public golf courses: The Links at Northfork and Rum River Hills.
- The City boasts two regional parks, 18 municipal parks, and over 80 miles of hiking and biking trails.
- Ramsey is served by five full-time firefighters and more than 60 volunteer paid-on-call firefighters, operating out of two fire stations.
