

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION APPROVING CERTAIN AMENDMENTS TO THE CLARENDON COUNTY EMPLOYEE GUIDELINES.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the County Council of Clarendon County (the "**County Council**"), the governing body of Clarendon County, South Carolina (the "**County**") as follows:

Section 1 Findings. The County Council hereby makes the following findings of fact in connection with the adoption of this resolution:

(a) The County Council has previously approved the Clarendon County Employee Guidelines, as last revised in December 2022 (the "**Employee Guidelines**").

(b) The County staff has recommended that the County Council approve certain amendments to the Employee Guidelines concerning County employees feeding feral animals on County property.

Section 2 Approval of Revisions to Employee Guidelines. The revisions to the Employee Guidelines submitted to County Council for review at this meeting are hereby approved. The County Human Resources Director is hereby authorized and directed to promulgate an updated version of the Employee Guidelines, as amended hereby, to County employees.

Section 3 Effective Date. This resolution, and the revisions to the Employee Guidelines approved hereby, shall be effective upon the approval hereof.

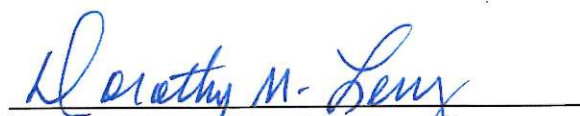

Attracting or feeding of wild/feral animals

The attracting or feeding of wild/feral animals on county property is a public nuisance and is prohibited at all times. "Wild/Feral animal" shall include any animal, which is not normally domesticated in this state including but not limited to deer, feral cats, feral dogs, squirrels, opossums, racoons, skunks, foxes, coyotes (feeding of song birds is exempt from this policy). This prohibition includes a person placing feeders or knowingly allowing food or other attractants to be placed on county property with the intent of attracting or feeding wild/feral animals. No person shall store pet food or animal feed in a negligent manner likely to attract wild/feral animals

Any violation of this prohibition may result in disciplinary action up to and including termination.
