TIPS FROM THE LEHI STORM DRAIN DIVISION

Automotive Work and Car Washing

When oil, antifreeze, and other fluids from your vehicle end up on your driveway or street, they will eventually be carried to the nearest river, lake, or stream when it rains. Even small oil and other vehicle fluid leaks can add up. In fact, a single quart of motor oil can contaminate up to 2 million gallons of drinking water! **Never dispose of vehicle fluids into the gutter, a storm drain, or drainage ditch, and place pans or absorbent materials under leaking vehicles.**
