STATION REBUILD

The City Council and staff intend to move forward with relocating Fire Station 61 to the corner of 200 West and Center Street (the old Senior Center site). This move will improve working conditions for Fire & EMS crews and allows for faster, safer emergency response by avoiding Main Street access constraints.

Over the next few months, the city will finalize design details and funding, with an expected completion in fall of 2027. The city does not intend to raise or introduce any taxes to fund the project.

The rebuild of Station 61 is expected to be complete in fall of 2027.

Power Lines Gotcha Down?

When working on a building or ladder outside, always look up for overhead power lines and stay at least 10 feet away. Do not trim trees around power lines or plant new trees underneath them—call or text the city at (801) 804-4550 instead. If you ever see a downed power line, stay away, keep others back, and call 911.

Utility Autopay

Set it and forget it with ACH Autopay, and take the shock out of paying your utility bill. Payments flow automatically each month, so you stay current without the paper, postage, or panic.
